

Rebuild Alabama Act January 2023 Report Subject:

The Rebuild Alabama Act gasoline tax provides infrastructure funding to the City and requires an annual reporting of how the funds were expended. In August 2021, the City Council approved the 2022 transportation plan with details of how the revenues would be utilized.

During fiscal year 2022, the City received \$468,837.25 in revenues and applied the funds to the following projects listed in the transportation plan:
