The City Council of the City of Auburn, Alabama, met in regular session on Tuesday, November 19, 2024, at 6:00 PM in the Council Chamber of the Auburn Public Safety Building at 141 North Ross Street.

John Cochran (878 Cherokee Road) thanked the Council for postponing item 10a2 and suggested extending timelines for public hearing notices.

Councilmember Witten asked for information about city options regarding the eagles' nest removal.

City Manager Crouch said the permit for removal of the eagles' nest is a federal permit and the City has no legal authority over that matter. She said one of the city attorneys could speak about revocation of business licenses as allowed in the business license ordinance but noted that revocation is only allowed under very limited terms.

City Attorney Paul Clark spoke about the City's business license ordinance and the terms it allows for revocation of a business license.

The Council asked questions about the business license ordinance and Mr. Clark answered the questions.

Councilmember Taylor said she is not a thief and just because someone disagrees with how she voted on an issue that does not make her a thief.

Councilmember Dawson said he is disappointed that Ms. Bolt attacked his character during her comments.

Councilmember Parsons said he is not a thief either and is happy with the short-term rental ordinance.

Mayor Anders said he is grateful for the passion of the community and wished all a Happy Thanksgiving.
